- 3 Kofi Annan said 'Education is, quite simply, peace-building by another name.' Do you agree? Answer with reference to your country and/or the Commonwealth.
- 4 What is the cost of peace

Students are directed about the format of the essay contest and benefits of taking part in this international essay competition like: Fecilitation by Queen Elizabeth Herself in UK, Merit Certificates like GOLD, SILVER and BRONZE Certificates and even participation certificates. Students exhibited enthusiasm in sharing ideas and points for the essay competition and 20 methods of bringing peace in the world was identified by group discussion and brain storming.







Students are writing their essay and submitting everyday through their class teachers, the essays are written in beautiful hand-writing and the same will be typed and uploaded to the portal of submission in the website of Royal common wealth essay competition. On last Saturday – April 8, 2017 – students from class VI to XII attended an interactive session where they shared 20 tools for bringing peace in the world and these twenty identified tools will be elaborated as – "My toolkit for peace". The original write-ups of the students will be recorded in the form of the book named – "Engineers of Peace".
